With a ribbed body, and garter stitch front panel, this little sweater can be worn alone, or as a layer under or over another sweater for added warmth.

It can be made in a sporty version with superwash

worsted [at left], or a luxury version, with angora [shown below].

SIZE

XS[S]

fits dogs weighing 5-10[10-15]pounds

FINISHED MEASUREMENTS

Neck: 8-10[9-12] inches Chest: 14-18[16-20] inches

MATERIALS

■ Sporty [bottom pic]: Lorna's Laces Shepherd Worsted [100% superwash wool, 4 oz. 225 yards], 1 hank

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- Luxe [top pic]: Lorna's Laces Angel [70% angora, 30% lambswool, 0.5 oz, 50 yards], 2[3] hanks
- 1 set US #5/3.75mm needles
- 1 24-inch or larger US #6/4mm circular needle

GAUGE

20 sts/28 rows = 4" in k2 p2 rib, slightly stretched, with larger needles

DIRECTIONS

Neck

Using smaller needles, CO 48[62] sts.

Row 1: [WS] SI 1, p1, *k2, p2* repeat from * to last 2 sts, p1, k1.

Row 2: [RS] SI 1, k1, *p2, k2* to end.

Repeat rows 1 and 2 until neck measures 1.5[2] inches, ending with a WS row. Change to larger needle.

Body Shaping

Row 1:]RS]: SI 1, k1, m1, work sts as they appear until 2 sts remain on L needle, m1, k2.

Row 2: [WS]: SI 1, p1, k1, work rib sts as they appear to last 3 sts, k1, p1, k1.

Row 3: [RS]: SI 1, k1 m1, k1, work rib sts as they appear to last 3 sts, k3.

Row 4 [WS]: SI 1, k2, work rib sts as they appear to last 4 sts, k2, p1, k1.

Repeat m1 increase on each edge of RS rows as established 10 times, $sl\ 1$, and k last st to maintain selvedges.

Continue to work the rib sts as established. When increases are complete you will have 70[84] sts.

Work pattern as established until piece measures 4.5[6] inches from beginning, ending with a WS row.

Divide for legs

[RS] SI 1, k6[7], BO 6 sts, work in rib as established to last 13[14]sts, BO 6 sts, k to end

Work is now divided into three sections.

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Leg shaping

[WS] Work each section separately, always sl first st and k last st on each section to establish/maintain selvedge.

Work sts as they appear until each section measures 1.5[1.75] inches from BO edge, ending with WS row.

Sections not being worked are held on the cable of the circular needle.


Body shaping

[RS] SI 1, k across first section, CO 5[6] sts, work sts across second section as they appear, CO 5[6]sts, k to end.

Continue to work sts as they appear until piece measures 10[11] inches from beg. BO all sts as they appear.

FINISHING

Sew together L and R edges to form tube. Weave in ends.
